Underline the most suitable form. In some sentences both forms are possible.

I hope Ben *is recovering* | *will recover* from his illness sooner or later.

He doesn't have enough money to pay for the bills. But I *won't lend* | *am not going to lend* him more.

I can see your luggage is quite heavy. I *will take* | *am going to take* it.

OK, you are not free on Thursday. What about Friday night? *Will you do* | *Are you doing* anything?

The weather forecast says it *will warm up* | *is going to warm up* soon.

Listen! Tim has asked me out finally. I *am going to meet* | *am meeting* him this evening at the cafe.

Do you need the architect, because *you are opening* | *are going to open* a new shop?

We've already booked the tickets. We *are leaving* | *are going to leave* by the 10.15 train.

Please, put the vase back on the table or you *will break* | *are breaking* it.

I've bought this old house, because I *am reconstructing* | *am going to reconstruct* it.
